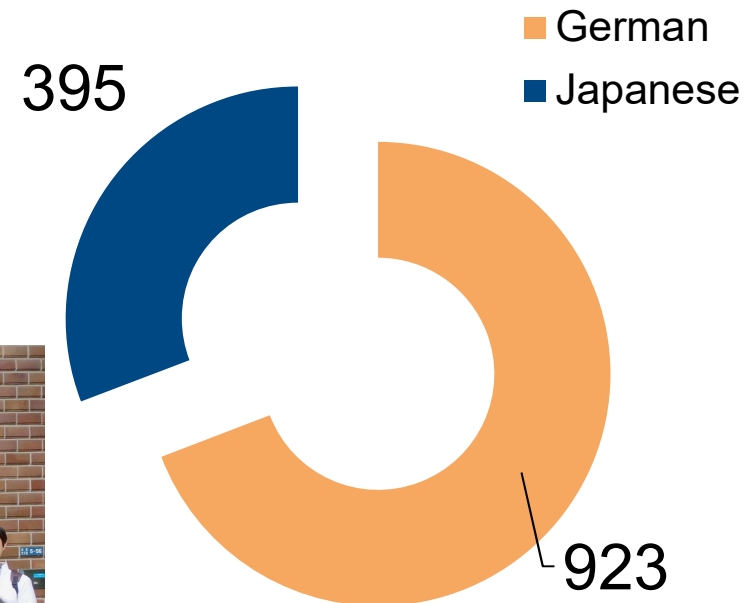

# ISAP - International Study and Training Partnerships



## Funding

- Scholarships for German students at a partner university (credit mobility)
- Short-term DAAD lectureship, tutorials, language courses, fact-finding visits and contact trips (for German side)
- Application: June – October (15th)

# Double Degree Programme

## Integrated international degree programmes with a double degree

- Support continuing internationalisation measures at higher education institutions and contribute to the structural development of study programmes.
- Focus - Exchange of academics and students, esp. increased mobility of German students.
- Programme launched in 2000 – For the Year 2016, the DAAD funded 134 double degree projects.
- Application: June – October (15th)

- Visiting Professorship (for German professors)

# Visiting Professorship (Japanese Professor to Germany)

## Visiting Professorships – Visiting Chairs

- One- to four-semester visit of a professor
- Focus: Internationalisation at home
- Programme launched in 1996: successful over 20 years
- Application: October-January (15th)



# Visiting Professorship (German professor to Japan)

## Visiting Professorships – Visiting Chairs

- One- to four-months visit of a professor (two weeks possible)
- Focus – Graduate studies (master, doctoral)
- (Financial) contribution by Japanese university, e.g. Housing
- Application: continuous

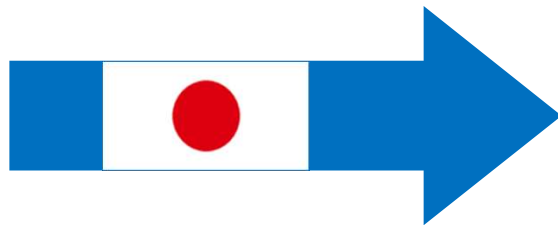

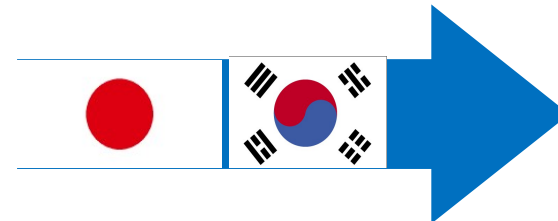


# Partnership Program with Japan and Korea since 2006

# Partnership Program with Japan and Korea

## Objectives

- To foster long-term co-operation between institutions of higher education through funding the exchange of individuals and groups
- To strengthen existing partnerships and initiate new bilateral or trilateral partnerships between Germany, Korea and Japan

## Funding measures

Various measures for foreign and German participants can be combined, e.g.:

- Joint research conducted by groups of researchers (including early career researchers and junior scholars)
- Individual stays for research and education purposes

## Funding

- Funding period up to 3 years, extension possible (flexible time frame up to one year for individuals)
- Mobility costs: travel and living allowances up to a maximum of 30,000 € (bilateral) and 40,000 € (trilateral)

- Application: June-July (30th)

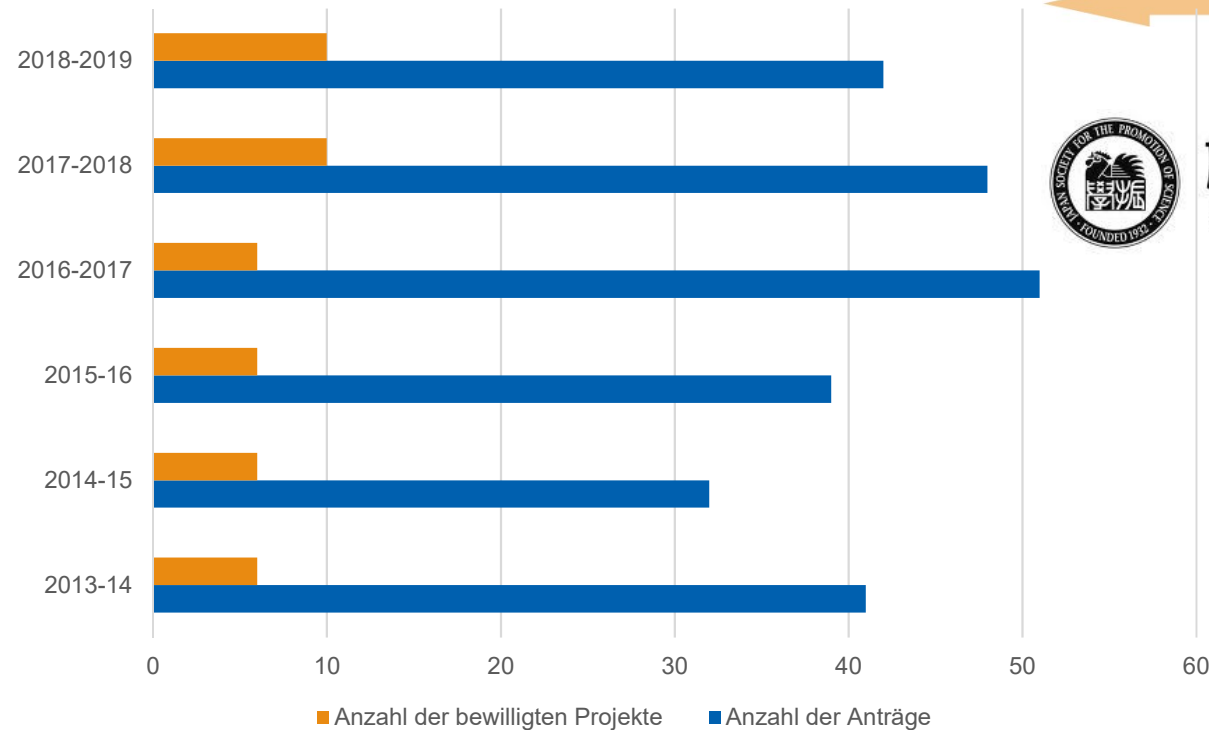

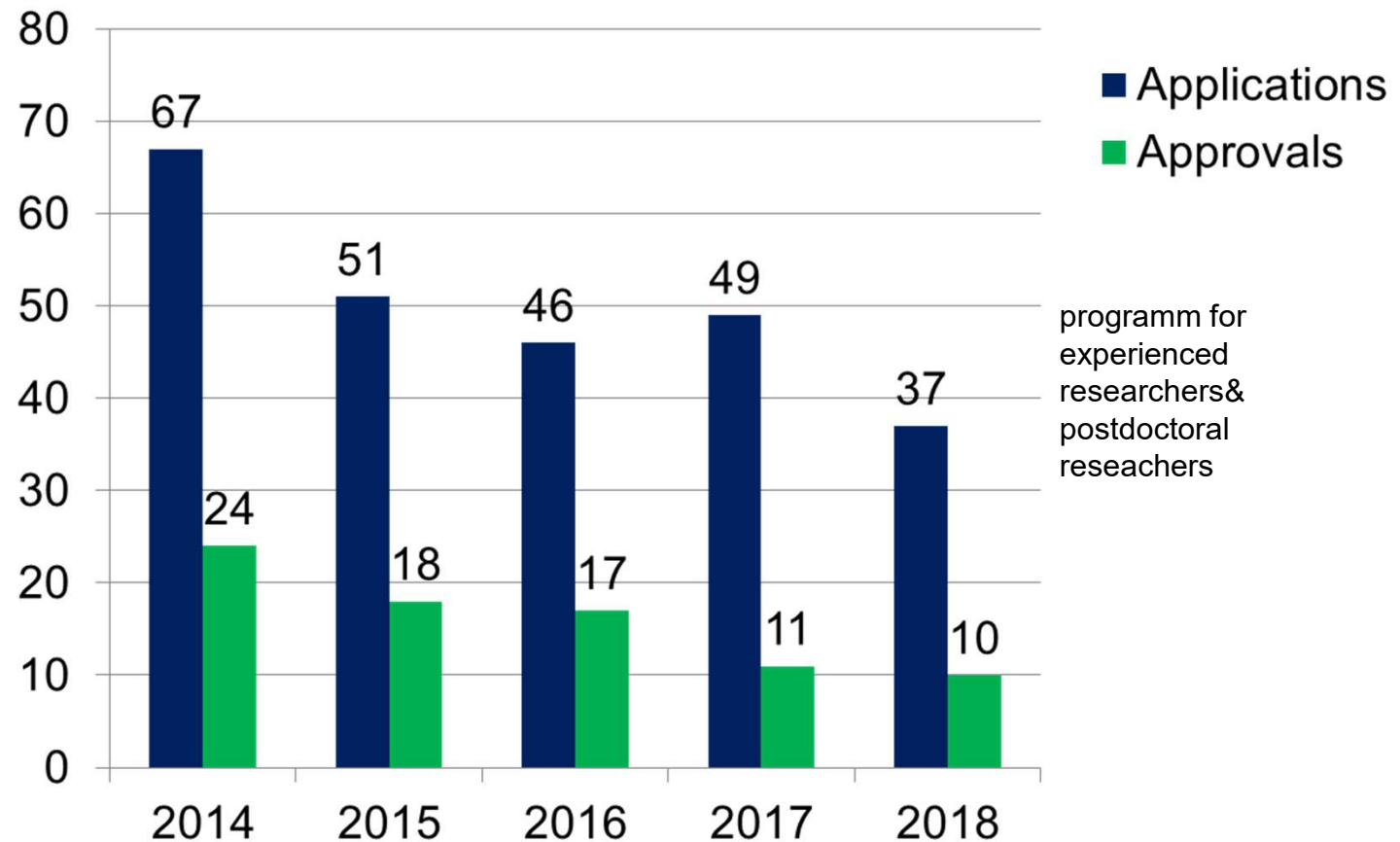
# Alexander-von-Humboldt Foundation: Research Fellowship

	Postdoctoral researchers	Experienced researchers
<b>Duration of sponsorship</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 6 to 24 months</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 6 to 18 months, may be divided up into 3 stays</li></ul>
<b>Application period</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• applications at any time, doctorates completed less than 4 years ago</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• applications at any time, doctorates completed less than 12 years ago</li></ul>
<b>Fellowship amount</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 2,650 EUR per month (~329.000 yen) (plus additional benefits)</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 3,150 EUR per month (~390.000 YEN) (plus additional benefits)</li></ul>



# Japanese Guest Researchers

- Between 2013-2018: 80 research fellowships were granted to researchers from Japan through the Humboldt Research Fellowship (success rate ca. 32%)



# German Research and Innovation Forum Tokyo
